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001 | INTRODUCTION/MISSION STATEMENT

Through the Star Foundation recycling fundraising campaigns more young people have greater opportunities, enabling them the freedom to enjoy a whole range of sporting and creative activities, including Music, Arts Media within school's and community led projects nationwide.

As we are all aware, the lack of community support and activities are major factors in the increase of gang culture and violence. One of the factors that led our key ambassador John Regis to kindly donate his time and influence to our cause is that his own nephew was a victim of a knife attack.

The young people of our communities play an integral part in the future development of our regions, by involving them in the Recycling campaigns that will generate income into their own clubs, school or social centres. Doing this The Star Foundation intends to create a greater community spirit and instill a sense of pride and self worth which in turn will encourage personal discipline and enhance community spirit.



When engaging with a club or school to help raise funds, we work with them and all their members to collect unwanted, clothes, shoes, CD/ DVDs and books, turning these into much needed funds for the clubs, schools, groups and local community projects that help young people in the UK. Our aim is to have as many clubs, schools and organisations on board our Rags2Riches recycling campaign so that more money can be re-invested into the grass roots of communities nationwide.

Mission Statement:

The Star Foundation strives to provide funding for less fortunate young people, giving them the opportunity to experience some of Europe's best sporting/creative facilities and activities. The Star Foundation will be looking to provide individuals that show potential and determination the equipment and in some cases the funding to allow them to attend and participate in their chosen sport or chosen career field.

The Star Foundation will be liaising with affiliated schools nationwide providing direct sponsorship to youngsters with recognised potential. We intend to aid families in need of help, giving their sons and daughters, that have shown potential and determination, a chance to build on this and fulfill their dreams.

The Star Foundation will concentrate on all areas of our society, specifically underprivileged areas, this includes all religions and minorities nationwide. The Foundation believes that no matter where you come from, what your beliefs are, or what your disabilities are, should you have any, we are all equal and one of many. 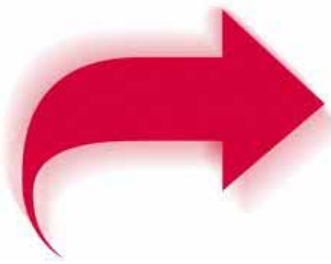

SportsUnlimited Content 003

Sports clubs from football, basketball to archery join the SportsUnlimited initiative to help raise funds to keep their costs down so more young people can enjoy sporting facilities and activities nationwide.

StarSchools Content 004

Schools nationwide are joining StarSchools to help raise funds to purchase art, sport and music equipment, also raise funds for the local community.



They raised £240.00 from 2 collections in 3months, recycling 750kg of clothes, shoes toys and books CD/DVD's

Community/Sponsorship Fund 007

To help facilities and activities based in the community stay open, purchase equipment, pay rent, travel costs, training gear, also the sponsorship of young people from all back grounds, all sports, & creative medium including art, drama and music. 20% of funds raised are placed in this fund from all collections.

Launching late 2010 will be our Community Swim Fund providing FREE swimming session to young people in all our communitiies.

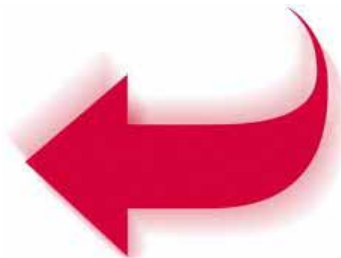

The Star Foundations Rags2Riches campaign, is geared around donations of unwanted garments and items, including adult shoes, clothing and lost property, cd's/dvd's, generating much needed funds for schools, sports, art, & drama clubs. Clubs/Groups raise funds for themselves and at the same time for other local community projects, helping more young people in your community.





003 | SPORTSUNLIMITED

The Star Foundation is looking to expand our unique SportsUnlimited campaign with all types of sport clubs, outdoor activities and facilities. We are already working with 5 a-side organisations, Cricket Clubs, Martial Arts Clubs, Fitness & Health Clubs, Basketball Clubs and many more.

The costs of running activities by volunteers are ever increasing and if it was not for the love and dedication of the volunteers these activities would no longer be available to our young people, in most cases the only way of maintaining these activities is to increase the fees paid.

Through the Star Foundation's SportsUnlimited campaign we aim to help raise funds using our Rags2Riches initiative in partnership with these clubs/groups and their members keeping the running costs down, thus providing more opportunities for young people to keep active and participating in a organised group environment.

Clubs will receive 40% of the funds raised in return for their efforts, with a further 20% been invested into other projects in the local community and sponsorship (Community/Sponsorship Fund) for young people.

It is common knowledge that young people with limited funds and little to do tend to hang around on the streets, leaving them vulnerable to criminal temptation and drugs as a means of escape. This joint campaign will help reduce the chances of this happening to young people. This venture will provide much needed resources for communities who also require support in reducing obesity and crime in their areas.

The Star Foundation Community Fund

This fund is set up to help provide funds for activities that provide young people with an alternative avenue to express their physical and creative energy. The fund is open to all groups, organisations, clubs and activities, they are able to apply in writing, online or by phone. Recommendations also come through parents who's children are already attending.

As part of our grant acceptance all group or club applications will be checked over by our committee to ensure the funds are being best placed. If the application is approved or declined we will invite each applicant to join our Rags2Riches campaign to help them raise funds for themselves, this will also help us invest more money into other projects locally, with this process and model the network will organically grow, with the community beginning to help itself without putting their hands in their pocket.

The StarSponsorship for young people

The funds are raised by working with all groups and clubs in the local area, through our StarSponsorship fund we will be providing sportswear, rent and funding to pay weekly fees in areas where individuals have been unable to afford to play sports. This initiative is known as 'Sports Unlimited'. With an increase in players entering events and enjoying the activities, an increase in the utilisation and trade for these local facilities will also happen. Ultimately this will create greater opportunity for young people. (also see StarSponsorship page)

003 | SPORTSUNLIMITED CONTINUED

The SportsUnlimited initiative is to partner with as many sporting organisations as possible through the Star Foundations Rags2Riches recycling campaign. This campaign is geared around donations of unwanted items and lost property, turning them into funds for the club.

StarActiv8 Outreach program:

Awareness of activities in the community

Through the Star Foundations StarActiv8 outreach program, our main objectives are making young people aware of what clubs, groups, activities and facilities are available in the local community.

Delivering this awareness

As the network of clubs/groups/organisations grows we will be inviting them along to local youth clubs and pre, primary and secondary schools, here they will have the opportunity to show how exciting and fulfilling their club, group or activity is. Through this outreach program many more young people in their local community will now be aware and hopefully be interested in something that the Star Foundation has presented in a relaxed and approachable atmosphere.

Conclusion of Outreach program

As we introduce these clubs, groups & activities to the young people, the potential increase in members to these clubs should be organic. This will help these activities survive and continue to provide young people with somewhere to go other than the streets, as more clubs come on board to the Rags2Riches recycling fundraising campaign the more money will be made available for grants and sponsorship to young people in the local communities we are working in.

Club Example:

Swadlincote Basketball Club

Joined Rags2Riches collected just under 1ton and raised £350 to pay their rent, helping keep their team playing so more young people are able to enjoy the game in the local area, also raising a further £175 towards our Community/Sponsorship Fund.





004 | STARSCHOOLS

Schools countywide are joining our Rags2Riches fundraising through recycling. Schools, Colleges and Universities are collecting unwanted clothes, shoes, CD/DVD's and toys from parents, pupils and staff.

When visiting a school on collection days we do not just want it to be about collecting the bags of unwanted items, when available we bring one of our ambassadors to spend some time with the children in the schools, (this maybe in conjunction with our selected partner Super Schools). The visit by the ambassador may also include mentoring, coaching and demonstrations.

The Star Foundation arranges collections that suit the school or college, this can be 3-4 times a year on a set date or collections can be all year round if the school has storage space.

Our partnerships with South Derbyshire, Derby City and County, East Staffs, West Lindsey and North East Lindsey Councils are providing support to the schools and sports clubs in the area. A fund is also available to help continue FREE swimming for young people all achieved by recycling peoples unwanted items.

005 | RAGS2RICIHES

The Star Foundation’s Rags2Riches Recycling campaign, is geared around donations of unwanted items, including shoes, clothing, CD/DVD’s and lost property.

The Star Foundation has negotiated a unique trade agreement with international partners, allowing them to purchase the clothing, shoes and other items generated by the Rags2Riches campaign. We have integrated Rags2Riches into other campaigns within the foundation fundraising initiatives including SportsUnlimited & StarSchools to make the most of peoples unwanted items.

Our current economy has put a serious dent in the sports and leisure market, through our Rags2Riches campaign we intend to help raise funds to keep costs down enabling more young people to enjoy clubs, groups & activities/facilities nationwide, and to also help schools purchase more equipment in areas that have been left behind, e.g. art, sport and music.

Clothing Collection Points:

- Carboot sales in the midland area.
- Schools pre-school, primary and secondary
- Sports clubs
- Charities/Organisations

Lost Property:

- Health Clubs
- Airports
- Hotels
- Schools

Who benefits:

- 40% to school, club or organisation
- 20% Community & Sponsorship fund
- 40% The Star Foudnation (help cover running costs)

Competition /Similar Organisation

Collecting clothes is not new and there are many companies and charities collecting unwanted clothing, however there is no other charity or not for profit organisation putting 40% back into the school or club who helped organise the collection, with a further 20% into community projects locally and also sponsoring local young people or into our community swim fund. The Star Foundation returns £540 per ton, other clothing recyclers returns are from £40.00-£400.00 per ton, the Star Foundation is not just about helping raise money we want to help leave legacies in schools, clubs and other organisations that the whole community can be proud of.

Help to other organisations/charities

As a community based enterprise we would be looking to help other organisations and charities that are not within our remit, by paying them for their collected clothing and shoes helping them increase their own turnover and assisting our tonage.

006 | STARSPONSORSHIP

StarSponsorship is an initiative within the Star Foundation created to help young sports & creative people to make the most of their abilities.

There are many exceptional young sports and creative people in the UK, but due to the lack of financial support they are unable to progress to the next level. Other government grants do not fund individual athletes or activities where young people may need assistance both financial and other forms of support. StarSponsorship has been created to help bridge this void. All potential candidates for funding will have to apply through our grants committee. Candidates will have to show enthusiasm, commitment, respect and above all evidence of their ability to the members of the committee. Check our website www.thestarfoundationic.org for criteria on sponsorship.

StarSponsorship will be funded through all campaigns and initiatives run by the Star Foundation, a percentage of all funds raised will be deposited into the community/sponsorship fund, unless it has come from a campaign or partnership run for StarSponsorship.

Level 1 Sponsorship

When engaging with a club, group or organisation to help incentivise members and also to help those members that are currently finding it hard financially, we will pay upto 12 months fees/subs to the club for the member that collects the most clothes, shoes, CD/DVD's. The Amount payable is dependant on the clubs fees/subs and will be confirmed on an individual club/group/organisation basis.

Level 2 Sponsorship

The fund will be open to all ages. Amateur and professional sports, art, drama and music will be considered. The committee are looking at the candidates ability and their desire to achieve their goals no matter how big or small. Check our website www.thestarfoundationic.org for further information.

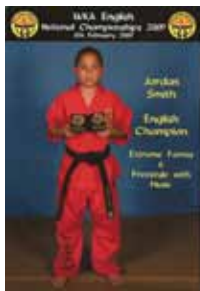

Raised £350 to help pay rent, keeping subs down and ensuring they stayed open.



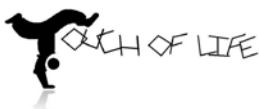
Rosliston Primary School total funds raised £40.96.
